
WHEREAS: the City of Fayetteville recognizes the many contributions that Hispanics have made and continue to make toward the betterment of our State and our community,

“HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH”


in Fayetteville, Arkansas and pause to celebrate the immeasurable contributions of the Hispanic community to our Nation, State and City.
