


- WHEREAS:** American women of every race, class, and ethnic background have made historic contributions to the growth and strength of our Nation in countless recorded and unrecorded ways, and

"WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH"


in Fayetteville, Arkansas and encourage everyone to join in one of the many events planned in our community celebrating the achievements of women both now and throughout our history.
