

Recycling Tips



Please do not place broken glass, tobacco products, needles or other trash with your recyclables—Protect our recycling truck drivers!

- Plastic bags are considered a contaminant; please return them to retail stores for recycling. Please use reusable bags instead.
- You do not have to remove paper labels from cans, bottles or jars.
- Please rinse out bottles and cans of food and liquid residue. Also remember to clean your recycling bins regularly—Protect our recycling truck drivers!
- Please take shredded paper and large amounts of cardboard boxes, telephone books, magazines, or newspapers to one of the City Recycling Drop-off locations.



* Organic materials can be 'recycled' by composting! For more information, see the City of Fayetteville Residential Yard Waste Composting Program brochure

- Many Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) items can actually be recycled, but only at proper facilities. Contact Boston Mountain Solid Waste District HHW Drop-Off for more information at 479 846 3005

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?



Cardboard

- Flatten & place under recycling bin
- NO waxed cardboard



Mixed Paper

All of the below must be clean and dry

- Newspapers & inserts
- White office paper
- Magazines & catalogs
- Junk mail
- Cereal (& other paperboard boxes)
- Telephone books
- NO waxy, coated, or metallic paper

Please make sure all paper is placed in the bin with the lid secured tightly; water and sunlight can ruin the value of the paper.



Steel Cans

- Labels OK
- Place metal lids inside steel cans



Aluminum Cans

- Cans ONLY, Please



Plastic #1 Bottles

- Caps OK
- Water bottles and soda bottles



Plastic #2 Bottles

- Caps OK
- Milk jugs and detergent bottles

Remember, "check the neck." Bottles have openings smaller than their base.



Glass Bottles & Jars

- All Colors
- NO ceramics or plate glass

Please remove all liquid, food residue, and plastic linings/wrappings from containers

HOW DO I DO IT?

Each household is provided **TWO FREE** 18 gallon recycling bins with lids. Extra bins are available for a small fee from the Recycling and Trash Collection Division.



Use the 2 bins to separate materials:

Please place paper in one bin, and all other containers (rinsed plastic bottles, glass bottles & jars, & metal cans) in the second bin. Please flatten cardboard and place under the heaviest bin.

If only one bin is used, please place paper either in a reusable bag* (available for purchase at the Recycling and Trash Collection Division for a small fee) or in a brown paper sack.

Please place recycling bins within 6ft. of the curb & at least 3ft. from your trash cart the night before your scheduled trash collection day.
