WHEREAS: on December 10, 1948, leaders of 48 countries joined together to ratify the Articles that compose the framework of the Declaration of Human Rights. As a document with world-wide significance, these 30 Articles assert the rights of every man, woman and child, and

WHEREAS: the Articles continue to remind us that the struggle for equal justice, whether in one's own community, or at the level of national government, is everlasting and ongoing, and

WHEREAS: we hereby honor the legacy of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by recommitting to its ideals, and

WHEREAS: recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world, and



"Human Rights Week"


in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
