**Proclamation**




- WHEREAS:** David and Beverly Engle moved from Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Rogers, Arkansas, in June of 1989 to founded a shelter for women and children in crisis called Restoration Village, and
- WHEREAS:** David and Beverly served their fellow Arkansans and other neighbors from around the world in an effort to restore hope, renew dignity, rebuild lives, and break the cycle of abuse, and
- WHEREAS:** David and Beverly provided safe shelter and life-changing services to those in desperate need, and
- WHEREAS:** through their tireless efforts, David and Beverly impacted thousands of lives and led Restoration Village for 32 years as its Founders, and
- WHEREAS:** they also founded the Children's Advocacy Center of Benton County which is co-housed on the same property as Restoration Village, where Beverly Engle led as the Executive Director until she retired from there in 2015, and
- WHEREAS:** after many years of dedicated service, David and Beverly Engle are now retiring from their roles as Executive Directors of Restoration Village.

**NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim September 26, 2020 as**
