#### **Economic Development Metrics and Activities**

- Eleven Business Expansion projects in progress
  - Eight Manufacturing, three Services
    - One in out of discovery into active recruitment, successful meeting with executives
      - Estimated 70 new HC over 5 years at average hourly wage \$30 to 40 per hour (updated)
      - Engaging with AEDC incentive approved
    - February addition is active and initial discovery, competing with one state
  - Estimated net new HC: 250+, Average wages: \$26.80+/-, net new payroll: \$14.5M
- April (Preliminary) Unemployment rate 2.9\*
  - Still improving and underlaying economy still strong
  - As expected, we are returning to pre-pandemic rates
- Public Meetings Still virtual, anticipate returning to in-person MAY/JUN
  - Committee meetings remain remote
  - Candidate forums will be remote






## **Unemployment Rate – 12 Month Trend**



- As expected, unemployment continues to decline
- The rate of reduction will likely decrease over the next several months
- Hardest hit continue to be restaurants, bars, and entertainment venues
  - We expect this sector to continue to experience labor shortages
- Likely to see unemployment fall below 3.0% by September
- May not see 2.2 to 2.4% range until early 2022

#### Long term impact of unemployment spike


- Persistent subsequent income reduction and/or loss

## Business License Open Date – 12 Month Trend



- A 4-year long term view continues to show an increase
  - · The underlaying economy remains strong
  - Business expansion inquiry picked up in the later half of JAN
  - March Open Date number is a preliminary report
- Beginning JAN 2021, the decrease in net Open Date begin to level off
  - While the first half will fluctuate up and down, we expect the overall trend to begin to increase
  - As more companies update their license the figures will improve






#### **Active Business License – March 2021**



3,616 active licenses with a date open prior to March 2021




# **Active Business FTE Equivalent – March 2021**

## New Business Employee Count – 12 Month Trend



- Recent new businesses opening with fewer new FTE equivalent positions
  - 2019 total positions relating to business open date was 2,300
  - 2020 total positions relating to business open date was 1,000 less than half prior year
  - 2021 YTD is less than 1/3 compared to same period 2020
- While signs of recovery are apparent, it's slow to materialize
