WHEREAS: symptoms and characteristics of autism may present themselves in a variety of ways and can result in significant lifelong impairment of an individual's ability to learn, develop healthy interactive behaviors, and understand verbal as well as nonverbal communication, and

WHEREAS: each year, people across the globe take time to recognize the millions of people living on the autism spectrum, including 1 out of every 68 American children. Americans with autism contribute to all aspects of society and are an essential thread in the diverse tapestry of our Nation, and

WHEREAS: it is important to ensure that persons living with autism have access to the lifelong care and services needed to pursue their full measure of personal happiness and achieve their greatest potential, and

WHEREAS: we all benefit when Americans with autism succeed therefore it is essential that we ensure our health care, education and social systems work for them, and


WHEREAS: Fayetteville is honored to take part in the annual observance of World Autism Awareness Day in the hope that it will lead to a better understanding of the disorder,

"WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS DAY"


in Fayetteville, Arkansas and encourage all citizens to become more informed about autism to help to create a better community for individuals with autism.
